



Prof. Dr. Süleyman İRVAN

Born in Bolu in 1962, Süleyman İrvan completed his undergraduate education at the School of Press and Broadcasting of Gazi University in 1987, earned his M.A. degree from the University of West Florida, USA, in 1990, and completed his Ph.D. in Journalism at the Institute of Social Sciences, Ankara University, in 1997. He served as an Assistant Professor at the Faculty of Communication, Gazi University, between 1999 and 2002, and as an Associate Professor at the Faculty of Communication, Eastern Mediterranean University, between 2002 and 2007. In 2007, he joined the Faculty of Communication at Akdeniz University. After being promoted to Professor in 2008, he was appointed Dean of the Faculty of Communication at Eastern Mediterranean University in 2010 and served in this position for five years.

Between 2012 and 2014, Professor İrvan served as the first readers' representative (ombudsman) of Yenidüzen newspaper, published in the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC). From 2013 to 2015, he served as the inaugural Chair of the Media Ethics Council established in the TRNC. In 2017, he was elected to the Communication Education Evaluation and Accreditation Board (İLEDAK), where he served until 2019.

Since February 2017, Professor İrvan has been a faculty member at the Faculty of Communication, Üsküdar University. He served as Head of the Department of Journalism between 2017 and 2023 and as Acting Dean of the Faculty of Communication from April 1, 2023, to January 10, 2024. On May 22, 2024, he was reappointed as Head of the Department of Journalism.

Professor Süleyman İrvan has published extensively in the fields of journalism ethics, journalism education, peace journalism, investigative journalism, press history, oral history, and communication theories.
